# Highlights of the month

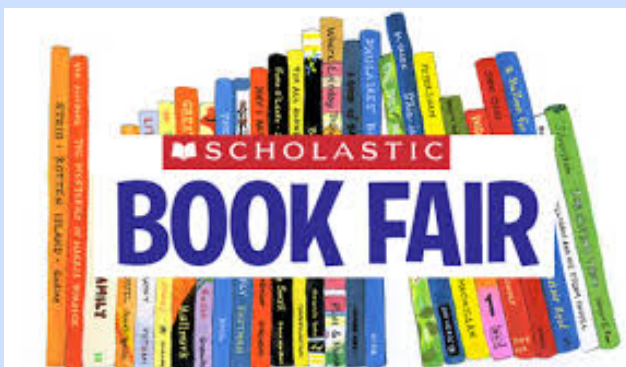
