Disco!!!

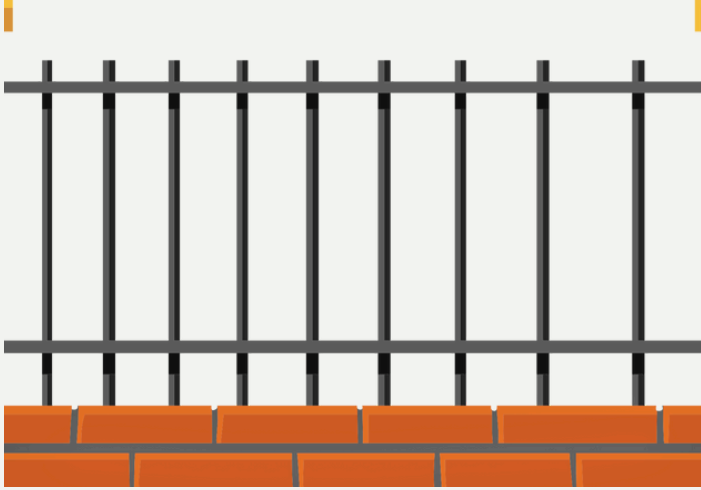
The children enjoyed an end of half term treat , looked amazing in their party clothes or costumes and danced with their friends.
